## SIMPLE PRESENT

### Affirmative

I play.  
You eat.  
He reads.  
She sleeps.  
It runs.  
We speak.  
You work.  
They study.

### Negative

I don't play.  
You don't eat.  
He doesn't read.  
She doesn't sleep.  
It doesn't run.  
We don't speak.  
You don't work.  
They don't study.

### Interrogative

Do you play?  
Do you eat?  
Does he read?  
Does she sleep?  
Does it run?  
Do we speak?  
Do you work?  
Do they study?

**AFFIRMATIVE** Subjet + verb (3 sing +s, or es)

**NEGATIVE** Subjet + do/does + not + verb

**INTERROGATIVE** Do /Does + Subjet + verb .....?
